Hello Friends.

One of the blessings of our work is meeting the special, loving people who choose to adopt and save animals in need of loving homes. Many remain in touch and remind us that their adopted dog or cat make their lives better in important ways. What a

wonderful legacy to save neglected animals and simultaneously change families' lives forever through the joy their animals bring.

A couple we met long ago have stayed in touch. Their 1997 visit was unique in that they were coming to meet Sir Arnold, a white rat, we rescued after we received a call that he was hungry and abandoned in a cage in a vacant apartment. Juli and Jeff drove from Pittsburgh and educated us that there are many who have pet rats. We did not know much about rats at that time, but we knew that Sir Arnold was special. He lived in my office and each day he shared my lunch. His favorite food was a bite of butterscotch pie which he nibbled from my fork. He made me appreciate rats; they have personalities too!

On Juli and Jeff's recent visit we laughed when they reminded me that in 1997, we were resolute to ensure that Arnold was not headed to be any snake's lunch. They brought their rat photo album - rats playing in cups at their home to assure us he would be safe. Arnold lived a good life with them.

At this same time a unique and interesting story of a hero African Giant Pouch Rat, was reported by the BBC World Wide News. Magawa life's work involved sniffing for landmines thus saving humans loss of limbs and life. Magawa's story bears repeating here because all animals are worthy of our appreciation. Sir Arnold taught us something we never would have dreamed, that rats can be loving. Magawa showed us that rats serve humans in vitally important work.

Magawa, Landmine-Sniffing Hero Rat Dies Source BBC World Wide News, 11 January 2022

Magawa, famous mine-clearing rat who was awarded a gold medal for his heroism, has died at the age of eight.

In a five-year career, this rodent sniffed out over 100 landmines and other



explosives. Magawa was the most successful rat trained by a Belgian charity to alert human handlers about the mines so they can be safely removed.

The charity said the African giant pouch rat "passed away peacefully" over the weekend.

Bred in Tanzania, Magawa underwent a year of training before beginning his bomb-sniffing career.

Trained to detect a chemical compound within the explosives. Magawa was small enough and light enough that he did not trigger mines if he walked over them.

Magawa was capable of searching a field the size of a tennis court in just 20 minutes - this would take a person with a metal detector between one and four days.

In 2020, <u>Magawa was awarded the PDSA Gold Medal</u> - sometimes described as the George Cross for animals - for his "life-saving devotion to duty". He was the first rat to be given the medal in the charity's 77-year history.

HeroRATs have been raising and training rats to detect landmines since the 1990s.
